EXPERIENCE (*The Texas Courthouse Project*)

Beginning in the spring of 2007, I began a personal project that combines my interest in architecture and photography: the creation of an online database of the Texas courthouse. From 2007 to 2016 I personally visited each of the 254 Texas counties, many more than once, and photographed all the county courthouses of Texas. The photographs and historic images of “lost” courthouses, with information on each county, are displayed on a website devoted to the Texas county courthouse: www.254texascourthouses.net

This is an ongoing project. I continue to revisit courthouses as they undergo restoration, repairs, alterations, and/or additions. My goal is to provide current views of each courthouse, along with information on the architects that shaped them.
